Members Update

Membership

Meetings

The Committee are keen to start holding meetings again. Obviously, we cannot meet face to face for the time being, so we are proposing to hold Club Meetings using Zoom. Zoom is available on most computing platforms including Windows, Mac, and various tablet devices.

We propose to restart our regular meeting schedule - the second Monday of each month at 8pm. Chris will circulate joining details to members. Note that we are using a free account which limits us to 40 minute meetings, and we may need to restart the meetings if they go on longer than this. The first online meeting will be Monday 8th February at 8pm. We'll circulate joining instructions.

Club Rides

We did have some level of club ride activity through last summer as Covid-19 rates were quite low and lockdown was eased. At the moment, we would encourage club members to avoid riding in groups and to observe national lockdown regulations.

Time Trials

Milton Keynes and surrounding counties went into Tier 4 just before Christmas. The Committee decided to abandon the 2021 New Year's Day '10', and communicated this via the NBRC Facebook Group page. We submitted our draft club time trial calendar to CTT London North at the end of 2020 (it's available at the website and via the posting at the Facebook Group). We've yet to hear back from London North, and when we do, we will notify the Police of our planned events.

The UK has been in Lockdown since 4th January, and as a consequence, the CTT has indicated that no time trials may take place until further notice. Our first club event was scheduled for late March.

When and if we are able to resume our club events, we plan to make some administrative changes to reduce the likelihood of Covid-19 transmission. This will include pre-entry through an online events management system.

Road Races (inc. Bowl events)

Milton Keynes Cycling Association, together with British Cycling, British Masters and local clubs are in process of planning a return to racing so that we are able to start as soon as restrictions are lifted. NBRC have decided not to participate in the organisation of a Spring Series this year.

The Bowl is now being managed by MK Dons and we have good contacts with them. We do not expect much will change at the venue this season but their aim is to build a football training facility in the long term and so inevitably there will be changes at some point.

Cyclocross

We believe the 2020-2021 Central Cyclocross league was abandoned due to Covid-19.

Online cycling activities

We understand that members may be exploring one or more of the online cycling

systems that are out there, and would like to explore whether members would engage in online group rides or events, and if so which platform would be most suitable.

This could be discussed at the online club meeting on 8th February.
